IAEH Outreach Reimbursement Application Form

The International Association for Ecology and Health serves a diverse international community including scientists, educators, students, policy makers, practitioners and the general public. The IAEH Outreach Reimbursement program was established to continue the development of regional and student activities, especially in developing countries, by supporting in-person meetings and long-distance outreach.

IAEH Outreach Reimbursements are small grants for communication or travel that specifically promotes transdisciplinary research at the intersection of conservation medicine, human health, and ecosystem sustainability. The maximum reimbursable amount for each application is US \$500. Applicants must be current IAEH members, and each applicant is eligible for one reimbursement per calendar year.*

IAEH Outreach Reimbursement applications are reviewed according to the following schedule:

1. Complete application forms submitted no later than six (6) weeks prior to outreach event
2. Application reviewed by IAEH Outreach Reimbursement Assessment Committee
3. Decision notification sent by e-mail within one (1) month of application submission
4. Itemized receipts, in total of reimbursement amount, submitted by grantee after outreach event
5. Check or wire transfer sent upon submission of all itemized receipts
