COHAB 2 CONFERENCE 2008

The second Conference on Health and Biodiversity (COHAB) has been scheduled for February 25–28, 2008 in Galway, Ireland. Delegates from 60 countries are expected to attend, including representatives from a number of United Nations agencies. Three workshops are currently scheduled: “Disaster Relief and Emergency Response”—harnessing ecosystem services for prevention, recovery, and redevelopment programs; “Food Resources, Diet, and Nutrition”—meeting food security and poverty challenges with biodiversity; and “Emerging Infectious Diseases”—integrating biodiversity conservation and management into disease prevention and control programs. It is intended that these workshops produce a series of reports to be presented at future meetings on environment, health, climate change, and development. Additional workshops are proposed to take place immediately after the main conference on topics including indigenous peoples’ nutrition and natural food resources, and biodiversity, trade, and health.

GLOBAL HEALTH AND DEVELOPMENT CONFERENCE

Yale University in New Haven, CT, will be hosting Unite for Sight’s 5th Annual International Health Conference on April 12–13, 2008. While several of the sessions are focused on vision-related issues in the developing world, several

ecohealth-related sessions are scheduled, including: University Collaboration in Global Infectious Diseases Research; The Environment and Global Health; Infectious Disease, Prevention, and Community Strategies; Neglected Tropical Diseases; Community Health Models; Innovative Strategies to Improve Health in the Developing World; and keynote addresses by Dr. Jeffrey Sachs, Dr. Sonia Sachs, Dr. Susan Blumenthal, and Dr. Jim Yong Kim. Many international public health and medical practitioners, researchers, and community health educators are expected to attend.

GLOBAL ANIMAL HEALTH INITIATIVE CONFERENCE

The World Bank and the World Organisation for Animal Health (OIE) held a Conference titled “Global Animal Health Initiative: The Way Forward” at the World Bank Headquarters in Washington, DC, October 9–11, 2007. This conference was held in collaboration with the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) of the United Nations. Attended by 123 veterinarians, public health practitioners, economists, and development experts, the primary goal was to share information related to the threats of emerging zoonoses and their movement in today’s globalized markets. The Conference confirmed that some of the most pressing needs are to fund gap analyses, to develop lobbying activities to promote investments in developing countries to support compliance with international veterinary standards, and to ensure adequate funding for crises involving epizootics and zoonoses in developing countries to aid in the prevention and management of public health emergencies linked to animal diseases.
